RULES AND REGULATIONS

DRESS Everyone mounted, whether competing or not must wear a hard hat to at least the minimum standard EN1384 with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Hats to specification PASO15:1998, ASTM F1163, BSEN14572:2005 are considered to offer greater protection than EN1384. American standard SNELL E2001, ASTM95 and Australian/New Zealand standard SNZ3838 1998 are also acceptable. Skullcap hats must be worn with a silk.

ENTRIES No verbal entries will be accepted. No entry fee will be returned without the production of a current veterinary certificate or doctor's certificate. No entry will be accepted without the appropriate fee. Classes will be limited and in the event of over subscription, MSRC members will be given priority. In the event of cancellation £2 will be retained to cover administration costs.

ORGANISER'S RIGHTS The organisers reserve the right to alter, change, cancel and / or amalgamate classes or refuse entry without stating a reason. The judge's / organiser's decision is final. All competitors must abide by the steward's instruction. Any persons riding or acting in a dangerous or inconsiderate manner or misusing whip or spurs may be asked to leave the showground and may be banned from future shows.

RULES Classes will be run under the relevant equestrian body rules i.e. British Dressage/British Riding Clubs and the British Horse Society. In the case of BD these are available from the BD office at Stoneleigh, Warwickshire CV8 2LR

DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY Save for death and personal injury caused by the negligence of the owners or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of the event to whom the rules apply nor the MSRC nor any agent, employee or representative of the Club accept any liability for accident, damage, loss, illness or injury to horses, owners, riders, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract, or in any way whatsoever.

OBJECTIONS Must be made to the Secretary in writing within 30 minutes of the incident accompanied by a £10 deposit, returnable if the objection is sustained.

HORSES, DOGS etc Dogs, bicycles, roller blades or similar are not permitted on the showground. Dogs must be confined to the owners vehicle. Horses / ponies must not be tied up outside boxes / trailers and left unattended. If any Horse / pony has been in contact with an infectious disease, it should not attend any shows, clinics etc.

HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY The organiser has the overall responsibility for Health and Safety. The event is organised in accordance with H & S legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the event are responsible for ensuring that (a) everything reasonably practical is done to ensure the H & S and welfare of those attending the event (b) they conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk (c) access and egress to the site is safe.

Results: In the event of two competitors having the same final score, the highest PTV mark will determine the final placings. The PTV will not be against the clock. Results will be available at the end of each class. If you are unable to wait for them please provide the secretary with a large S.A.E.

A two phase competition. The Control of Paces section will be completed before the PTV obstacles

Phase 1 - CoP - Control of Paces

This phase is designed to demonstrate that the rider can control the pace of their horse. The rider enters a marked corridor in canter as slow as possible. The corridor will be 50m long. The rider then returns along the same track in walk, but as fast as possible. Maximum of 30 points for each pace. Points are given on a sliding scale. A break of pace or a step outside the corridor will result in a zero score for that pace.

Phase 2 - PTV - Obstacle Course

This course will have 10 obstacles, which the rider and horse will be required to negotiate. Some are attempted unmounted. If there is any obstacle that the rider does not wish to attempt, then they tell the judge at the obstacle and continue riding the course. They will not be eliminated. The jump will be at the height of approximately **2' 0" for classes 1,2 and 3 and 2' 4" for Class 4**. Details on how the obstacles are to be ridden and judged will be available on the day. A maximum of 10 points will be awarded for each obstacle.

The PTV will not be ridden against the clock. However, there will be a time limit which will be advised on the day, after which competitors will be asked to leave the arena. No points will be gained from obstacles completed after the time limit has expired.

Class 1 - Newcomers

for riders that have not taken part in a full Trec, or have been placed 1st to 3rd in any Indoor or Versatile Trec class before 1st October 2011

Class 2 - Novice

For riders that have not been placed 1st to 3rd in a full Trec competition before 1st October 2011

Class 3 - Open

Open to all

Class 4 - Advanced Open

Open to all

Rosettes will be awarded from 1st to 6th place. Prizes depending on entries.
